AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVE

For the reasons set out in the background section, the CASA delegate whose signature appears below issues the following Airworthiness Directive (AD) under subregulation 39.1 (1) of CAR 1998. The AD requires that the action set out in the requirement section (being action that the delegate considers necessary to correct the unsafe condition) be taken in relation to the aircraft or aeronautical product mentioned in the applicability section: (a) in the circumstances mentioned in the requirement section; and (b) in accordance with the instructions set out in the requirement section: and (c) at the time mentioned in the compliance section.

Compliance: As specified in the Requirement document, with a revised effective date of 29

November 2001.

This Airworthiness Directive becomes effective on 29 November 2001.

Background: The FAA requires modification of the escape slide latch assembly, and for certain

aircraft, installation of a cover on the slide inflation cylinder. The required action is intended to prevent failure of an escape slide to deploy or inflate correctly, which

could result in the slide being unusable during an emergency evacuation.
