AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVE

For the reasons set out in the background section, the CASA delegate whose signature appears below issues the following Airworthiness Directive (AD) under subregulation 39.001(1) of CASR 1998. The AD requires that the action set out in the requirement section (being action that the delegate considers necessary to correct the unsafe condition) be taken in relation to the aircraft or aeronautical product mentioned in the applicability section: (a) in the circumstances mentioned in the requirement section; and (b) in accordance with the instructions set out in the requirement section; and (c) at the time mentioned in the compliance section.

This Airworthiness Directive becomes effective on 16 March 2006.

Background:

An interference problem may exist between the bottom of the ground spoiler trailing edge and the upper surface of the flap. This condition could lead to a higher pretension at ground spoiler bearing arm No.3 and No. 8, which could result in

premature cracking.
