Background:	This Directive implements the requirements of FAA AD 86-17-02 which supe FAA AD 79-18-04. Amendment 3 to the Directive extends the dye penetrant inspection to forks of all serial numbers following a fatal accident in the USA involved failure of a shot peened fork.
